

ADDRESS OF HIS HOLINESS JOHN PAUL II TO THE MEMBERS OF THE "SAINT PAUL FOUNDATION"

Consistory Hall Saturday, 24 October 1992

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I am pleased to greet you, the members of the *Saint Paul Foundation*, on the occasion of your visit to Rome. Your association seeks to promote the active involvement of individuals and groups in the life of the community, especially through charitable activities and programs aimed at responding to the social, educational and cultural needs of your neighbors.
