

## ADDRESS OF HIS HOLINESS JOHN PAUL II TO THE PILGRIMS FROM THE DIOCESE OF RICHMOND, VIRGINIA

Dear Bishop Sullivan, Dear Friends in Christ,

I am pleased to meet this Pilgrimage of Faith from the Diocese of Richmond, on the occasion of the hundred and twenty–fifth anniversary of the founding of the Diocese and Bishop Sullivan's twenty–fifth Anniversary of Episcopal Consecration.

You have wished to come to Rome, to the tombs of the Apostles Peter and Paul, in order to express and strengthen the bonds of faith and love between your local Church and the See of Peter, to which has been entrusted, in the words of the Second Vatican Council, the "mission to provide for the common good of the universal Church and for the good of the individual churches" (*Christus Dominus*, 21).
